How to publish Articulate files onto Google Drive


Sometimes you just want to get your product out there but you do not have money to purchase a host site or want your project available fast. Well this tutorial maybe for you.

In this tutorial, I created an updated .pdf version of a video on YouTube created by Articulate. (You can view it here.) Before you begin, you will need to have your Articulate project published. Your project should be publish for the web. (I published my files into several formats. It does not matter if other formats like iOS are in the folder, as long as you have an html website in there. It will work fine. Articulate separates these files into separate folders.)

Before you begin, make sure you have a google account. Go to www.google.com and create an account.


Follow these steps and you should be ready to share your project with the world!

1. Locate your Articulate **output file**. In this case, my output file is named George Washington.



2. Open http://drive.google.com and sign in.


3. Take your output folder and drag it to Google Drive.




4. Next you will need to create an index file. Locate the file called **presentation.html**.




5. Right click and choose **Rename**. Rename the file **index.html**.




6. Next, right click on your **output folder** and select **Share**. (My folder is called George Washington.)



7. In the share dialogue box, click **More**.




8. Next, make sure **On- Public on the web** is selected and click **Save**. The previous box will appear. Click **Done**.



9. Open a new tab on your web browser and type the following: http://googledrive.com/host/



11. Paste the last portion on your newly opened tab. Hit **enter** on your keyboard and your project should appear and work like a charm!



12. To share your project, **copy the full link** from the top of your project and send that link to your audience.
