COUNTY FISCAL LETTER (CFL) NO. 17/18-19E

- SUBJECT: PRIVATE ADOPTION AGENCY REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM FY 2016-17 OVERAGES AND ONGOING CLAIMS
- REFERENCE: CFL NO. 17/18-19, DATED NOVEMBER, 15, 2017

This errata provides updated county specific amounts which must be reimbursed to the state for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-17 shortage in 59th County funds for the Private Adoption Agency Reimbursement Program (PAARP).

Subsequent to <u>CFL No. 17/18-19</u>, the amounts for Humboldt, Imperial, Mariposa, Mendocino, and Trinity counties have been revised. Due to the revision, each county's percentage of the total PAARP costs was adjusted, resulting in a change to each county's repayment amount. The methodology to distribute the overage did not change. Attachment I displays the revised amount each county is required to reimburse the California Department of Social Services (CDSS). The CDSS will invoice the counties as noted in Attachment I. The counties will have 30 days from the invoice date to reimburse CDSS.

To ensure counties can track adoptive placements and finalizations, counties should keep copies of all signed AAP4 forms and adoption orders. With the AAP4 forms and adoption orders, counties will be able to keep their own records of how much PAARP can be claimed for each case.
