





- 1842- MA limits 10 hr./day
- AFL (American Federation of Labor)proposes no workers under 14 yr.
 - 1892- Democrat Party stance- No person under 15 in the factory.
- 1938-40 hr. work week, no workers under 16 during school hours.



FACTORIES

- S. Slater-R.I. System
- 1793-1st mill
- 1835- owned/partner of 13 mills.
- Hired families
- As young as 7-12 yrs. old worked
- -Carding machines
- -Water frames
- -Roving machine





Slaterville (Mill town)



- Built by Samuel & brother John
- Town layout:
- 2 Multilevel houses for workers
- Owner's house
- Company store
- Workers paid with company credit
- Mill
- Other- tailor, dressmake butchers, etc.



Lowell

- Lowell system-water powered mill
- 1814- MA:1st mill
- 1st in MA- to use the Arkwright
 System
- Workers-young, unmarried women from farms ages 15-30 yr. old
- Over 8,000 workers





Lowell (mill town)

- Boarding houses for workers (6-8 per rm.)
- Pay-\$2-4 wk., 12-14 hr, 6 day/wk.
- Room and Board-\$1.25 wk.
- Bell-breakfast/dinner
- Encouraged women to take classes/form clubs
- Lowell Offering-magazine
