Summary: The Barbara B. Payne Collection of Oral Histories consists of fifteen United States Army, three Air Force, and two Marine Corps Oral Histories from World War II veterans. The following veteran interviews are included: Lucian W. Burnett, Edgar M. Buttenheim, James A. Cokeley, Neal Daniels, James M. Gassaway, Rev. Joseph W. Hess Jr., Martin E. Jenkins, Curtis S. Jones, George Lewis Kalb, Richard Kleiner, John B. Koelle, Curtis W. Lafey, William W. Lamond, Theodore S. Matter, David Neifeld, Erwin F. Perry, Eldon Searle Sizer, Dr. Burton L. Williams, David Kelly Kagan, and Margaret Frantz Wellington. Topics covered in the oral histories include African-American units; French/Arab, German/Italian, and Chinese/Russian relations; fraternization; POW Camps (Chieti, Moosburg, Szubin, Hammelburg, and Forrest); slave labor; POW escape committees; electronic warfare; USO shows; Battle of the Bulge; Battle of Hurtgen Forest; Paris liberation parade; conditions on ships; displaced persons; pacifism; use of Japanese prisoners; intercept work and Morse code; B-29 squadron; segregation; and the GI Bill.

Biographical/Historical Note: Barbara B. Payne was born in Ithaca, New York, on 12 July 1918. She graduated Cornell University and served as Assistant Dean, College of Arts and Sciences, at Cornell from 1964-1974. Payne conducted the veteran interviews in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. She passed away on 19 January 2008.

Summary: The Julius M. Hummel papers consist of a recounting of Hummel's life and service with the Army Air Forces in World War II. The narrative is written in the third person, and no author is given. The narrative describes Hummel's life as a prisoner of war (POW), escape attempts, and his rescue by the 12th Armored Division.

Biographical/Historical Note: Julius M. Hummel was born in Sandwich, Illinois. He enlisted in the United States Army and a short time later joined the U.S. Army Air Forces. He flew bomber escort missions from England with the 38th Fighter Squadron. Hummel was shot down on 18 April 1944 and was captured by German soldiers. He escaped on 3 April 1945 and was rescued by the 12th Armored Division on or about 13 April 1945. He separated from the Army on 30 November 1945.

Summary: Historically, prisoners of war have placed tremendous burdens on capturing units and logistical systems. Numerous World War I and II after-action reports cite the lack of planning for enemy prisoners of war (EPW) operations as a major shortfall. Such planning failures had the very real potential of adversely affecting the outcome of several decisive battles and campaigns. With very minor differences, today's enemy prisoners of war doctrine is but a carry-over of the World War II experience. 'Doctrine in Need of Revision - Anyone Listening, Anyone Care?' is a critical review of today's EPW doctrine as contained in FM 19-40. Through selected points of argument, the study critically examines areas in conflict: the compatibility of EPW doctrine to the Airland Battle; our inability to execute the EPW mission under current doctrine without significant degradation of other essential missions; the need for innovative solutions to the problems that are not parochial, but serve the betterment of the whole; the recognition that there are major disconnects between the prime players in the EPW arena--Military Police, Military Intelligence, Transportation, and the Health Services; and lastly, the identification of force structure shortfalls that impact on EPW operations in the corps and division.
