# Warm Up

## Instructions

1. The game will be similar to an auction.
2. You will each have 3 items to auction to the rest of the group. You will also have a total of \$1,425 to buy items from other students.
3. When it's your turn to auction one of your items, you must:
  - a. Describe the item. The better you describe, the MORE MONEY you will earn!
  - b. State the starting amount, which is listed on the back of your card.
  - c. When your item is sold, say, "VENDIDO!" (Sold).
4. When you make a bid:
  - a. Raise your paddle and state a higher price if you want the item. Make sure you have enough money!
5. There will be 3 rounds and every student will auction one item during that round.
6. In order to receive a stamp for today, YOU MUST ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE AND PLAY FAIR AND FRIENDLY.

\*\*\* A few minutes before lab is over, please put the original amount you started with back in the bag.

This is the original amount:

10 - reds (\$1's), 3 - greens (\$5's), 5 - teals (\$10's),  
5 - oranges (\$20), 3 - purples (\$50), 6 - yellows (\$100's), 1 - pink (\$500)
