



Write a letter as if you were a first-hand witness to the scenario you chose.	Create a timeline of events regarding the event(s) you wish to research. (Timeline complexity and number of events is a work in progress. Have a conversation with your teacher during this process)	Illustrate a short comic book detailing the main people, historical significance, and events of your choice a WWII category.
Interview several people who are experts in the subject area. (This may require phone/skype interviews if people agree)	Create a mini-movie detailing the main portions of the historical events you choose.	Create a song and music video that touches on one of the following; pro-war propaganda song, historical information, or detailing the life of an WWII soldier.
Create a lesson plan for a 5th grade level. This should include something to get the kids excited, a lesson that they are active in, and then an assessment.	Find eight must-know vocabulary terms/events from the historical scenario you chose. Next, write eight (one for each) newspaper articles as if you were a reporter during that time explaining to the nation the significance of that term/event.	Create a presentation to share with the class over the event(s). If you choose a chain of events, share with the class the main points. If you choose a singular event, go in-depth especially focusing on different perspectives of people involved.
